1202 & 1204 N Central in “Happy Hollow”

Knoxville Preservation and Development, LLC is headed by local Architect **Daniel DesMaret Schuh**. The firm specializes in rehabilitating structures, both commercial and residential, surrounding downtown Knoxville. Since its inception KP&D has completed over 20 rehabilitation projects, saving multiple historic homes and businesses.

The Happy Hollow property is the latest project. The property includes seven tenant spaces in 5 buildings with almost 13000sf of space. Built primarily from 1920 to 1930, the buildings had seen very little modernization until the current rehabilitation. Businesses of all types have thrived in the spaces over the years.

1200 Central was Weeks corner drug store, behind it on E. Anderson were a beauty and barbershop. **1202 Central** was a butcher in the front and a jeweler in the rear when built, since then it has served as a grocery, bar and furniture store. **1204 Central** was built as a White grocery that eventually moved to 1208 Central. **1206 Central** was a restaurant, the Minute Cafe, and has also been a repair center for over 40 years. **1208 Central** was built as a two-story provisions store. For some reason, the second floor was never used and was eventually removed. You can still see the location of the stairway and the paint on the second floor walls. This eventually became the White grocery store (their 4th location in the Hollow).

KP&D looks forward to the revitalization of Happy Hollow and is proud to be a part of **Knoxville's best historic commercial district**.

All these spaces are available for rent.

The Fourth and Gill Historic District is an excellent example of the neighborhoods that flourished in Knoxville during the last quarter of the 19th Century. This was the period of the city's greatest economic boom, which was fueled by manufacturing and the railroads. The railroads also helped Knoxville become one of the leading wholesale centers in the South. These economic successes were based primarily on the notions of unrestrained capitalism and urban growth. Known as New South Urbanization, this ideology encouraged such things as urban transit, better public facilities, and the concept of suburbia.

Old North Knoxville was developed as a streetcar suburb between the 1880's and the 1940's. Streetcar suburbs had a strong pedestrian orientation. Most people walked to their homes from the street car stop. The automobile did not have a major influence on Knoxville until the 1920's, so there are few driveways or garages in the neighborhood. Some carriage houses remain behind the oldest houses, but most people did not own a horse and carriage. They depended on the streetcars for transportation and used the neighborhood sidewalks to reach the streetcar lines.

Late 19th century styles found in the neighborhood include: Queen Anne, Queen Anne Cottage, Eastlake, Shotgun, and Folk Victorian. Early 20th century architecture include: Craftsman and Bungalow, Colonial Revival, Tudor Revival, Dutch Colonial Revival, Neoclassical, American Four Square, Minimal Traditional, and French Eclectic.

North Hills is one of the post World War I and pre-World War II subdivisions that sprouted in Knoxville. Brothers George, Hugh and Carl Fielden started developing North Hills in the spring of 1927. By 1928, forty-three homes had been built with some of Knoxville's most prominent families living in the area. Covering 185 acres, it was one of the largest subdivisions in Knoxville for its time. It was an upscale neighborhood that had its own private bus service to downtown Knoxville.

C.B. (Brown) Atkin was born on Gay Street in 1864 across from the Knox County Courthouse. He later married Mary Burwell, and they lived for many years at 518 West Main.

In 1901, Atkin, a successful businessman, selected an area between Central and Broadway that at the time was fertile farmland covered with vines, evergreens, and rose bushes. He purchased the land from the Churchwell family, and the community of Oakwood was begun.

Brown Atkin named many of the streets in Oakwood for friends and business associates. Caldwell Avenue was named for Joshua Caldwell, a distinguished attorney. Harvey Street, for Charles H. Harvey, the president of Knoxville Railway and Light Company. McMillan was named for E. E. McMillan, a neighbor of the Atkins. Morelia Avenue was named for a small town in Mexico where the Atkins had vacationed, while Churchwell was named in honor of the family from whom Atkins had acquired the land.

Oakwood was more than an early subdivision. Atkins laid out the Oakwood business district between the 2200 and 2600 blocks of North Central Street. For many years, Oakwood had grocery stores, Brown's Cafeteria, shoe shops, barber shops, a drugstore, and as many as six service stations.

Many of the homes have some late Victorian influence, while others display Craftsman characteristics, including some California bungalow styles on Churchwell and Caldwell. As many as 150 homes were later constructed for returning veterans of World War II.
